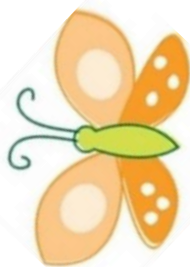




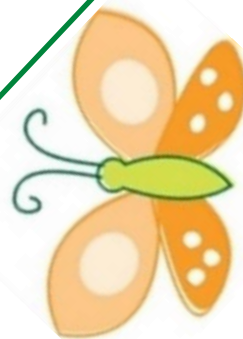

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## Who are We Planning For?

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Youth in their later teen years (14-17 years old ) with physical disabilities, developmental disabilities and/or who are medically complex.

During ages 0-17 years old youth receive services from children services. Prior to the youth turning 18 years old, they must apply and qualify for funding through adult services which have different criteria than children's services.

## What Transition Are We Planning For?

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- The transition out of children Services
- The transition through high school and into post secondary school or career path
- The transition to a higher level of independence
- The transition to adult service providers (if applicable)

## Why Transition Planning?

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Transition planning refers to the transition out of children's services and transition into adult services. Although some youth will continue to stay in school until their 21st birthday and receive school health services (Physiotherapy/Occupational Therapy), most clients will no longer receive services from Lansdowne Children's Centre after the age of 18. Before discharging, Lansdowne wants to ensure the youth and their family have a plan for the future

As teens approach the age of 16, the Lansdowne staff supporting the family and/or school will have a discussion of what the plan is for the future (next few years/beyond high school). Through these conversations, staff will have a better understanding of what kind of adult services the youth may be eligible for and what relevant goals the youth may have for their future. Some examples of goals could include: finding a volunteer opportunity, joining a social activity, specific goals around home that may lead to a higher level of independence, exploring post secondary options or finding a part time job.

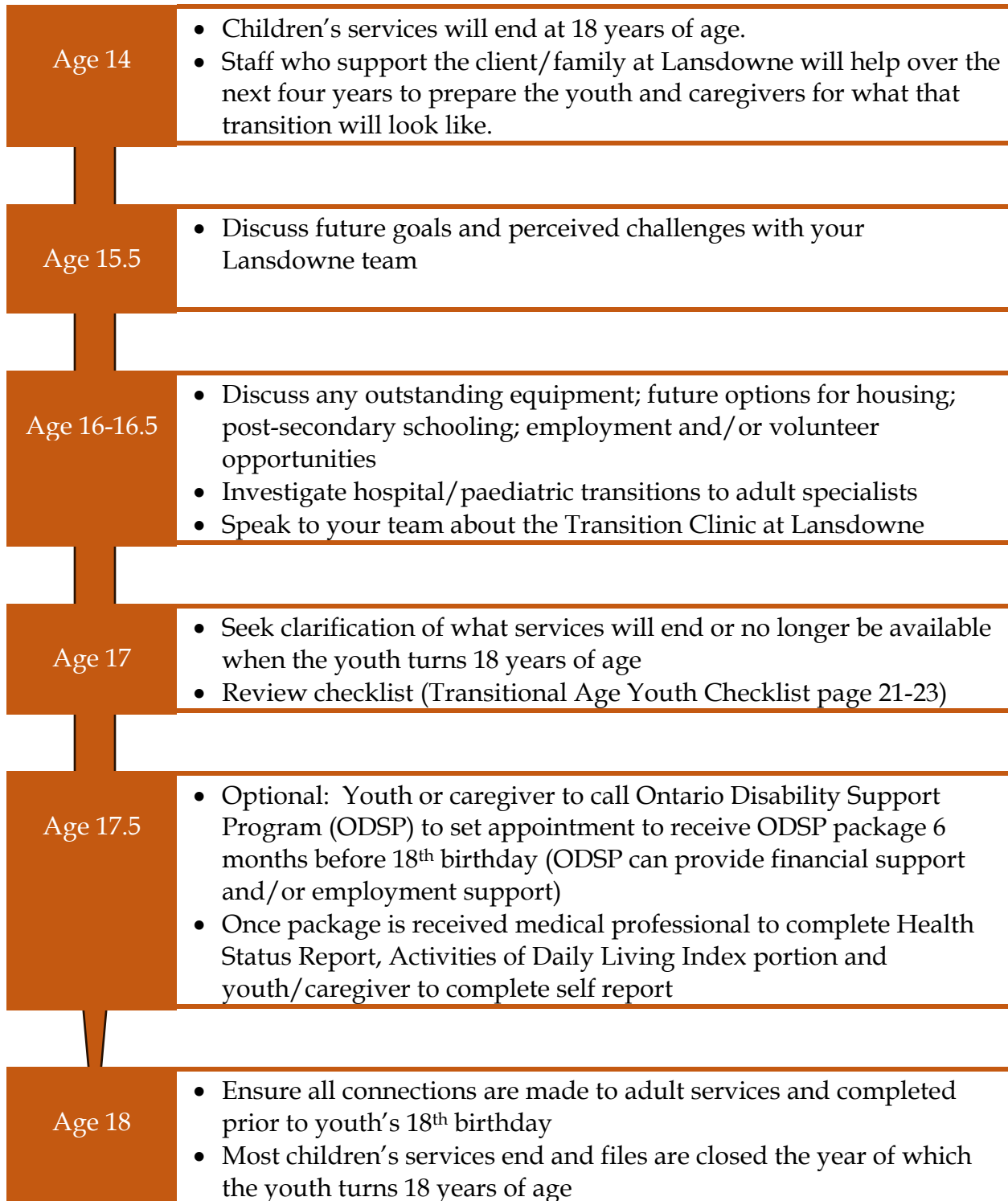

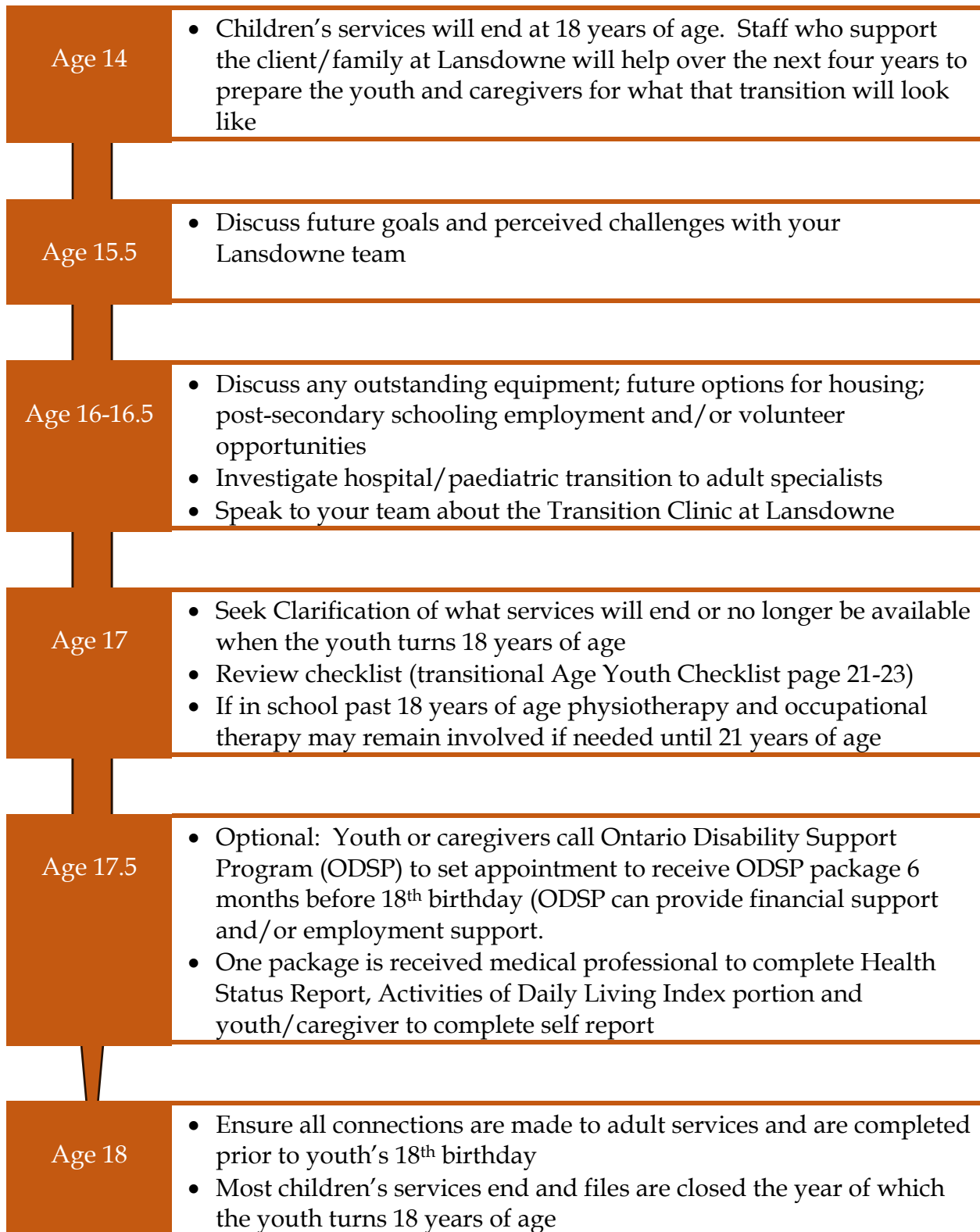

## Transition to Adult Services: Suspect or Confirmed Developmental Delay Guidelines

### Age 14

- Children's services will end at 18 years of age
- Youth/caregiver or Lansdowne staff to call Contact Brant to register the youth for transition planning
- Psychoeducational assessment will be required for eligibility to Developmental Services Ontario (DSO). If you don't have a copy, a copy may be found in Ontario Student Record (Located at current school)

### Age 15.5

- Complete or review Transitional Age Youth (TAY) Plan with assistance from Lansdowne Children's Centre, Contract Brant, the School Board and/or services meaningful for the youth (collaboration plan)
- If a psychoeducational assessment is not in the Ontario Student record, ask the Learning Resource Teacher if the youth is on waitlist

### Age 17

- Seek clarification of what services will end or no longer be available when the youth turns 18 years of age
- Reach out to Contact Brant for referral to Developmental Services Ontario (DSO)
- If a psychoeducational assessment has not been completed, the youth can wait until 18 years old to have assessment done by Twin Lakes for free (referral through Contact Brant) or family can pay for one privately (list available through Ontario College of Psychologists)

### Age 17.5

- Optional: Youth or caregiver to call Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) to set appointment to received ODSP package 6 months before 18<sup>th</sup> birthday (ODSP can provide financial support and/or employment support)
- Once package is received medical professional to complete Health Status Report, Activities of Daily Living Index portion and youth/caregiver to complete self report
- If DSO has confirmed eligibility, a letter stating this will be sent to the youth//caregiver to share with ODSP to fast-track eligibility
- If query developmental disability, Contact Brant to make referral to Twin Lakes for Psychological Assessment at no cost to confirm developmental disability

# Transition Clinic

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## **Purpose:**

To offer information and resources to youth who are transitioning from children's to adult services. The clinic will provide youth the resources they need to help make their transition successful as well as offer emotional support through their journey.

## **Who is Eligible?**

The clinic will be offered to Lansdowne Children's Centre clients 16 and over. Please note, clients who have qualified for Developmental Services Ontario are not eligible for the clinic.

## **Clinic Outline:**

Before attending clinic, youth will be sent two surveys to fill out with the help of their caregivers. Additional support will be provided to complete surveys if needed.

At clinic, youth will be provided with resources based on their responses and identified goals. Resources include but are not limited to: housing supports, information for attending doctor's appointments independently, information on income and employment supports, and information about getting a driver's license.

Youth will also spend time discussing any emotional concerns about their transition and creating a pathway for their future.

Please note, two clinic days may be provided if needed.

If there is a need for additional support after attending clinic, Lansdowne's Children's Centre's Child and Youth Worker will continue to follow and support their transition needs.

### Developmental Services Ontario (DSO) (Developmental Disability Only)

- Confirm eligibility for adult developmental services at 16 years old (provide psychological assessment)
- If eligible for services, DSO will complete the application through 2 meetings
- At 17 ½ years old they can apply for ODSP income and supports. Need to provide eligibility letter from DSO to ODSP. They can also apply for ODSP's supported Employment program whether they are receiving ODSP income or not
- At 18 years old, DSO will refer them to the supports and services identified (Willowbridge Community Services, Community Living, Brantwood Community Services)

## Disability Tax Credit

- The Disability Tax Credit (DTC) is a non-refundable tax credit that helps persons with
- disabilities or their supporting persons reduce the amount of income tax they may have to pay. An
- individual may claim the disability amount once they are eligible for the DTC.
- The purpose of the DTC is to provide for greater tax equity by allowing some relief for disability
- costs, since these are unavoidable additional expenses that other taxpayers don't
- have to face.
